

**JUNIOR BEEF SHOW
CIBC \$300.00 SCHOLARSHIP
SENIOR HIGH AGGREGATE**

Scholarship Rules

1. ONLY entrants age seventeen (17) or older as of January 1, 2010 are eligible.
2. Entrant MUST be entered in each of the following classes:
 - a) at least one (1) conformation class
 - b) showmanship
 - c) fitting
3. Money will be sent directly to post-secondary institution when proof of enrollment at specified institution is received. Proof of enrollment can be any, but not limited to, the following documentation:
 - a) receipt of tuition paid
 - b) bill for tuition due with valid student identification number
4. Selection process will be as follows:
 - a) aggregate points in junior show for each of the above three (3) classes will determine top three (3) junior entrants who will be notified of their achievement and will advance to an interview. In the case of multiple entries in the conformation section (i.e.: entrant shows a cow/calf as well as a heifer), the entrants best placing will be taken as the score to be used for aggregate points.
 - b) the interview process will consist of a panel of three (3) judges. The judges will follow a score card and will award points in the areas of post secondary education (40%), cattle involvement (40%), and other activities (20%).
 - c) the final selection will be a combination of the show portion (conformation, showmanship, and fitting) worth a total of eighteen (18) points, as well as the interview portion worth a total of one hundred (100) points. The winning entrant will be the one with the highest overall score out of the available one hundred and eighteen points (118).
 - d) the decision of the judges panel is final and may not be contested.
5. The winner must submit necessary documentation to the IPE Beef Committee. If no documentation is received, money will go toward the next years scholarship fund and the winner will forfeit the scholarship money.
6. Once an entrant has won the scholarship, he or she is ineligible for that specific scholarship in subsequent years.
7. Unsuccessful entrants may reapply in subsequent years.
