SPECIAL ATTENTION is called to the **Commitment to Animal Care, General Rules & Regulations** printed at the beginning of the prize list. Failure to abide by IPE rules may result in disqualification, forfeiture of prize money & possible disbarment from the fair.

****NEW**** Division 4 exhibitors must be current members of Horse Council British Columbia, OR carry equivalent membership (i.e. Alberta Equestrian Federation), OR carry a 3rd party liability insurance policy and have the Interior Provincial Exhibition added as additional named insured with proof of certificate sent to the IPE office in advance of the fair. EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

MOVE IN exhibits are received on Tues, August 30th

MOVE OUT no exhibits or displays are to be removed from the IPE grounds (without prior approval from the Director) until Sun, September 4th, at 8pm, on a staggered basis. Exhibitors are invited to stay overnight on Sunday and come for a free pancake breakfast on Monday before departing.

LATE ENTRIES no late entries will be received unless approved by the Division 4 Director.

ENTRY FORMS Please submit entries as soon as possible as stall space is limited. Correct and completed entries with full payment take priority. Entries are accepted on a first come, first served basis. Entries are now accepted online at www.armstrongipe.com, if you have any questions come down to the IPE office or give us a call at (250)-546-9406. Post entries for horses that are previously entered in the show can be made with advance notification to the show secretary.

REFUNDS will be made with a doctors or veterinarian certificate turned in to the show office prior to the start of the show.

STABLING standing stalls and tack stalls are available at no charge. A separate \$25 stall cleaning deposit cheque (per

horse) is required (Send by mail or call office with cc number) and will be returned if the stall(s) are stripped clean at the end of the show. ****New**** - box stalls are not guaranteed but may be available on a limited basis at \$20 per horse per night. Please have stalls cleaned by 8am and keep alleyways clear and tidy. Competitors are required to bed their own stalls on arrival.

STALL DECORATING exhibitors are asked to include stall decorations as part of their exhibit, to attract the attention of the public. The winners of the Best Decorated Stall will be announced on Sunday afternoon. 2022 theme: "Our Roots Run Deep". Judged by Heavy horse and small draft judge, Prizes: \$50, \$30, \$20

AWARDS Ribbons and prizes will be awarded to 1st - 5th place winners. please consider recycling/returning your ribbons to the Division 4 committee before leaving the show grounds. The Al Jenkins Memorial Top Teamster trophy will be presented to an exhibitor at the end of the show.

PRIZE MONEY Heavy Horse and Small Draft classes receive: 1st: \$100, 2nd: \$90, 3rd: \$80, 4th: \$60, 5th: \$35, unless otherwise stated. All prize money cheques will be mailed to exhibitors, after the fair including (**NEW**) those participating in the Heavy Horse Pull.

JUNIORS to be 21 years or under as of January 1st of this calendar year. Juniors under the age of 16 years must be accompanied by an adult in the cart/wagon at all times. The use of ASTM/SEI or BSI approved equestrian helmets are strongly encouraged. Juniors are not permitted to show a stallion.

SHOW ATTIRE exhibitors must present themselves with proper show attire based on industry standards. For hitch classes it is recommended that men wear a hat, tie, and collared shirt (jacket or vest optional) and women dress semi-formal (no jeans). Gloves are recommended in all driving classes. In Halter classes, exhibitors should dress semi-formal (no jeans). In the Heavy Horse Pull, exhibitors should present in a professional manner and wear collared shirts. The Director may at his/her discretion bar any entry from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

****NOTE****: Heavy Horse and small draft classes will alternate.

HORSE AND EXHIBITOR WELFARE Horses must be cared for and presented in the highest standard. Horses must be sound, fit, and healthy, and exhibited with safe and properly fitting harness and equipment. Exhibitors are expected to maintain a safe environment, demonstrate ethical care for horses, and exhibit standards of professional behavior always. Injured horses may be requested to be removed from the fair grounds at the discretion of the show committee. Any horse that does not appear to have enough training or experience may be asked to stay in the barn. Exhibitors are always expected to conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner - any infraction of this rule is to be reported and will be dealt with by the committee in charge. The Division 4 Director retains the right to dismiss any exhibitor who does not comply. All complaints and inquiries will be made to the Draft Horse committee, (not the IPE office).

HEAVY HORSE HITCH CLASSES

For the purposes of this show, Heavy Draft horses will consist of the following breeds: Percheron, Belgian, Clydesdale, Shire, Suffolk Punch, Mules and other breeds at the discretion of the committee. ****NOTE****: Heavy Horse entries must show in a draft harness with a collar and Hames

GENERAL CLASS RULES

1. Any changes to the class schedule will be posted 24 hours in advance
2. Patterns and courses for hitch classes and the log skid will be posted 24 hrs in advance of the class
3. Pattern and obstacle classes can only have one driver ***no double entry***
4. Loose exercising of horses in rings is prohibited
5. Throat latches are required on bridles
6. Under no conditions shall a bridle be removed from a horse while it is still put to a vehicle (even if there is a halter under the bridle). Failure to comply will result in elimination
7. The horse(s) must never be left unattended while put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will result in elimination
8. Use of long whips in halter classes is prohibited
9. In Halter classes, all foals must be exhibited on the halter. Mares may accompany foals into the ring, and foals may accompany mares into the ring
10. Age of the horse shall date from the first of January of the year in which they were foaled
11. No horses may leave the show ring during a class in session before prizes are awarded unless dismissed by the judge
12. All stallions 1 (one) year and over must be exhibited in a bit
13. Due to limited space, horses are to be hitched in the hitching ring only
14. No driving around infield prior to class
15. No more than 3 (three) persons may ride on a wagon in a hitch class
16. Class #33 – Amateur Four Horse (pattern): open to any driver who has not completed a 4-horse competition or previously won this class at the IPE. This class is not suited to beginners
17. Exhibitors in class #6 – Authentic Farm Implement, will be asked to remove farm implements from the hitching ring following the completion of the day's classes
18. Use of whips are encouraged for all single and team classes. The whip must be in the driver's hand (not in the whip holder) and be long enough to reach the wheel horse without compromising the position of the driver
19. Horses entered in conformation classes must present in a show harness, preferably with scotch tops and braided, however, show shoes and checks are not mandatory
20. Small Draft exhibitors may use a wagonette or cart in single driving or tandem classes
21. Only exhibitors and assistants are permitted in the hitch ring
22. All exhibitors must have entry number clearly visible on the persons back or on the back of the vehicle while in the hitch ring or show ring
23. Headers should be available for all hitch classes

24. No passing without permission
25. The judge must excuse from competition any unsafe vehicle, unruly horse or driver clearly out of control
26. Post entry in classes #42 and #43 are available at directors discretion
27. The JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL

LOG SKIDDING GUIDELINES AND RULES

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- No multiple use of teams, Teamster may enter as many teams as he or she

desires as long as entry fees are paid for each team

- The judge will meet with teamsters, prior to competition to go over the rules

- Patterns will be posted the day before the class

THE COURSE:

- Parallel lines 32 feet apart
- End lines or closed end 16 feet from last pylon
- Distance between pylons to be 16 feet
- Two logs 16 feet long, chained together at pulling end
- If pylons are moved during contest the Judge to reset
- This will be timed and fastest time will break any ties

PENALTIES:

- Each teamster starts contest with 100 points
- 5 points will be deducted for each of the following:
 1. Team steps on or over line
 2. Teamster steps on or over line
 3. Team, Teamster or rigging touches line or pylons
 4. Logs touch pylons or sideline
 5. Teamster must step over logs when passing pylons

DISQUALIFICATION:

- Riding on logs
- Arguing with the Judge
- Swearing, whipping, slapping or rippling of reins
- If off course, each contestant must enter the course right side of pylons, and exit left side of pylons
- Pre-marking of stops
- Passing of lines over pylons or walking on the wrong side of the pylon (pylons are to be thought of as tall trees)

STOPS:

- On stops, a penalty point will be assessed for each inch under or over on each stop, teamster will be scored to the closest inch
- Any movement of logs constitutes a pull
- The team with the highest number of points wins. In the case of a tie the team with the fastest time wins
- The JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL

DRAFT HORSE PULL GUIDELINES AND RULES

- A minimum of six (6) teams entered or Pull will be cancelled
- Pullers must be in stalls with vehicle off grounds by 9:00am the morning of their pull
- All teams completing three lifts will receive \$100.00 (No hook up money for the Friday pull)

PULL REGULATIONS

1. All teamsters and hookers MUST wear proper show attire

such as matching shirts

2. Pull must be held in a secure area where general public is protected
3. Only entered competitors, hookers, headers and officials allowed in pulling area
4. To ensure public safety, teamsters will be asked to participate in a parade to the hitch ring
5. Boundary lines are 16 feet apart, length of pull is 14 feet
6. Off set double trees and neck yokes are allowed
7. Absolutely no dragging of double trees until team is in the pull area
8. Each teamster is allowed two helpers, two hookers, and one header. If helpers coach or interfere in any way, team will be disqualified. Header must leave the pulling boundary lines; teamster and hooker must remain behind hindquarters of horse
9. Either teamster or hooker may ride in front of the boat
10. There shall be no riding in the boat
11. Once the team has been hooked to the boat, they must stay between the boundary lines. If team touch boundary lines, teamster can unhook & re-attempt a full 14 feet pull. Lines will not be waived on second attempt
12. Team allowed two tries to move the boat 14 feet. An unsuccessful attempt by the teamster to start the team constitutes one try. If boat moved six inches forward, it constitutes a pull. Team can be unhooked & re-hooked for second lift
13. The pin and chain laid out flat measures 14 feet. Pin must be out completely to qualify as a pull. A whistle will indicate a successful pull
14. Deliberate stalling will result in disqualification. Judge to warn teamsters once
15. Deliberate jerking of load is prohibited. Team will be disqualified and will revert to previous weight pulled
16. Whipping, slapping of lines at any time will result in disqualification and will revert to previous weight pulled
17. There must be two linesmen and a pinman to assist the judge. The linesmen have the authority to tell the judge of any infractions and the judge must act upon their information.
18. A teamster may ask the judge to center the boat before hooking. If there are no means available to center the boat, the judge may wave off the side line rule and ask the teamster to center the boat during the pull.
19. If a break in harness or equipment occurs, there will be a time limit of five minutes to fix the break and complete the pull. If a teamster forfeits the pull or a five minute time limit expires on the pull at which the breakage occurred, they must pull the next weight the full distance or the weight recorded goes back to the previous completed pull
20. Teamsters are not to argue with or harass the judge. To do so will result in instant disqualification, and they will forfeit all prizes. Any complaint should be made to the pull committee
21. All teams will be weighed prior to the pull on the same scale. All horses will be offered unlimited water before weighing
22. After a meeting of pull officials, an unmanageable team may be disqualified
23. Weight for each lift will be decided by pull committee
24. Each team must pull each additional weight. No double

lifting to be allowed except for the final pull the teamster can decide the weight

25. The committee reserves the right to conduct a random drug test or spot check by a veterinarian for contesting teams
26. Talking or shouting is permitted, but not the use of profanity
27. Three tries to hook to the boat otherwise disqualified and weight reverts to previous pull
