SPECIAL ATTENTION is called to the **General Rules & Regulations** printed at the beginning of the prize list. Failure to abide by IPE rules may result in disqualification, forfeiture of prize money & possible disbarment from the fair.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

1. All flowers must be grown by the Exhibitor in the open classes. No hot house flowers permitted in any class.
2. Colour variation allowed unless colour specified.
3. Plants must be the property of the exhibitor for at least two months (this rule does not apply to decorative classes).
4. Please bring your own containers.
5. Containers used for floral entries **MUST** be CLEAR GLASS, except where bowls are specified in bench classes, arrangements not included.

EXHIBITS DROP OFF Horticulture Hall, Mon, August 28th, 5pm to 8:30pm or Tues, August 29th, 8am to 11am, you will receive your exhibitors pass when you drop off your items.

EXHIBITS PICK UP Horticulture Hall. Please pick up exhibits & prizes Mon, Sept 4th, 9am to 11am. After that time, they will be moved to the IPE Office (3010 Wood Ave, Armstrong, BC). You can pick up your unclaimed items until Sept 22, 2023 (upon which time they will be donated)

CUT FLOWERS

NOTE: Cut Flowers will be judged on:

Form - Uniformity, proper shape, & proper petal age.

Stem & Foliage - strength &/or straightness, quality, size & proportion.

Colour - uniformity, intensity, clarity & brilliance.

Size - uniformity & proper size for variety.

Condition - must be free of blemish, pests, disease & damage.

DEFINITIONS

ANNUAL: a plant that grows, blooms, seeds & dies in one year, & is reproduced from seeds.

PERENNIAL: a plant that lives for more than two (2) years from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground.

BLOOM: one bloom to a stem without side buds. For roses blooms with side buds ½ to ¾ open, having a high pointed center.

CUT: a branch with leaves, flower & buds or blossoms.

FOLIAGE: the leaves of any plant or stem bearing only leaves, colour variation allowed

SPRAY: a cluster of blooms at the end of a cane. A spray should have 2 or more blooms, (note a bud is not a bloom)

BUD: one bud, sepals shown, showing colour & not more than ¼ open

Definition of "bowl" - is wider than it is high

Definition of "vase" - is taller than it is wide & has a small opening.

Definition of "basket" - must have a usable & accessible handle.

Definition of "novel" - unusual in an interesting way. The IPE is not responsible for valuable containers.

No points allotted for containers.

Carafes in half litre & litre sizes donated by Casabello Wines, Penticton will be available to use as containers for some cut flowers & rose entries. A table will be provided to prepare entries.

A **MEMBER** of the floral committee will assist the exhibitors where needed.

Judged by BC Council of Garden Club Standards.

DAHLIA:

(All Dahlias need to have two leaves on stem)

5. Dahlia, decorative, 1 bloom over 10"
6. Dahlia, decorative, 1 bloom 8" to 10"
7. Dahlia, decorative, 1 bloom 6" to 8"
8. Dahlia, decorative, 1 bloom 4" to 6"
9. Dahlia, cactus types, 1 bloom over 10"
10. Dahlia, cactus types, 1 bloom 8" to 10"
11. Dahlia, cactus types, 1 bloom 6" to 8"
12. Dahlia, cactus types, 1 bloom 4" to 6"
13. Dahlia, ball, 1 bloom, over 3½"
14. Dahlia, decorative, miniature, under 4", 3 blooms, 1 variety, 1 container
15. Dahlia, cactus types, miniature, under 4", 3 blooms 1 variety 1 container
16. Dahlia, ball miniature, under 3½", 3 blooms, 1 variety, 1 container
17. Dahlia pom poms, 5 blooms, 1 container

18. Dahlias, 1 container, miniature, 5 stems
19. Dahlias, any other variety, not listed
20. Dahlias, basket of mixed varieties, front facing

GLADIOLUS:

(Size of bottom of flower for measurements of Gladiolus)

21. Gladiolus, giant, 1 spike over 5½"
22. Gladiolus, large, 1 spike 4½" - 5 ½"
23. Gladiolus, medium, 1 spike 3½" to 4½"
24. Gladiolus, small, 1 spike 2½" to 3½"
25. Gladiolus, miniature, 3 spikes up to 2½", 1 container
26. Gladiolus, not miniature, 5 spikes, 1 container, any colour
27. Helianthus (sunflower), 3 stems, 1 container
28. Marigolds, 1½" - 3" blooms, 1 container
29. Marigolds, 4" plus blooms, 1 container
30. Marigolds, miniature blooms, 1 container
31. Pansies, 1 bowl, 5 blooms with own foliage
32. Petunias, double with own foliage, 7 stems in bowl
33. Petunias, single with own foliage, 7 stems in bowl
34. Rudbeckia, variety named, 3 stems, 1 container
35. Snapdragons, standard variety, 5 spikes
36. Snapdragons, double variety, 5 spikes
37. Sweet Peas, 5 stems
38. Zinnia, any type, 5 blooms
39. Annual, any other type not listed, 3 stems, 1 container
40. Flowering shrub, any type, 3 stems, 1 container
41. Flowering perennial, any type, 3 stems, 1 container

Roses must be named if specified

Incorrect naming of any rose will NOT result in disqualification although it should not be encouraged

Specimen Blooms: ½ to ¾ open

Hybrid Tea - usually have one flower to a stem with side buds

Floribunda - usually have a spray of bloom at the end of a cane

Grandiflora - are between the hybrid teas & the floribunda in flower pattern

Shrubs, Climbers, Miniature & Old Garden Roses - these types have become intermixed in their breeding & it is often necessary to look it up in a reference book to find out to what type a particular rose belongs

ROSES:

42. Roses: 1 H.T. red or red blend, variety named
43. Roses: 1 H.T. white or near white, variety named
44. Roses: 1 H.T. yellow or yellow blend, variety named
45. Roses: 1 H.T. pink, light, medium, dark or blend, variety named
46. Roses: 1 H.T. orange, orange blend, orange pink, orange red or russet, variety named
47. Roses: 1 H.T. apricot or apricot blend, variety named
48. Roses: 1 H.T. mauve or mauve blend, variety named
49. Roses: 1 H.T., fully open bloom of Hybrid Tea or Grandifloras, stamens may or may not be showing, side buds not allowed
50. Roses: 1 H.T., 1 bud showing colour & not more than ¼ open

51. Roses: H.T., 3 stems of 3 different roses, each a different colour displayed in vase. **Prizes:** 1st: \$8, 2nd: \$5, 3rd: \$3
1) Top bloom: 1 bud, sepals down & at least 2 petals unfurling, but not more than ¼ open. 2) Middle bloom: 1 exhibition stage bloom. 3) Bottom bloom: 1 fully open bloom stamens need not show

52. Roses: H.T., 3 stems of one variety displayed in 1 vase
Prizes: 1st: \$8, 2nd: \$5, 3rd: \$3
1) Top Bloom: 1 bud, sepals down & at least 2 petals unfurling but not more than ¼ open. 2) Middle bloom: 1 exhibition stage bloom. 3) Bottom bloom: 1 fully open bloom stamens need not show

53. Roses: Floribundas, 1 spray any colour
54. Roses: Floribundas, Garden Bouquet - minimum 3 blooms or 1 spray in a vase with home grown flowers, herbs, or shrubs etc
55. Roses: Grandifloras, 1 spray any colour
56. Roses: Grandifloras, 3 stems any colour with or without side buds

SHRUB ROSES:

(With or without side buds, a portion of the previous stem growth can be attached)

57. Roses: Shrub, (not David Austin Rose), 1 spray with or without side buds, single or semi double petals
58. Roses: Shrub, (not David Austin Rose), 1 spray with or without side buds, double, full or very full petals
59. Roses: Climbers, (not David Austin Rose), 1 stem with or without side buds of a large flowered climber

DAVID AUSTIN ROSES:

(With or without side buds, a portion of the previous stem growth can be attached)

60. Roses: David Austin, 1 spray any colour
61. Roses: David Austin, Garden Bouquet minimum 3 blooms or 1 spray of shrubs, climbers or Austin in a vase with flowers, herbs or greenery etc. any colour
62. Roses: Old Garden Rose, 1 stem any colour
63. Roses: Old Garden Rose, 3 sprays, 2 or more varieties in a vase
64. Roses: Miniature Rose, 1 bloom without side buds, any colour, 1 container
65. Roses: Miniature Rose, 3 decorative blooms with or without side buds, 1 or more varieties, any colour
66. Roses: Miniature Rose, 1 spray any colour
67. Roses: Miniature Rose, Garden Bouquet, minimum 3 blooms or 1 spray in a vase with flowers, herbs, or greenery

FRAGRANCE ROSE:

(Fragrance to count for 75%, quality of bloom 25%, limited to 1 bloom per vase, display in a bowl or sniffer with an opening sealed with plastic wrap (only to be removed at time of judging))

68. Roses: Fragrance, Old Garden Rose, any colour
69. Roses: Fragrance, Hybrid Tea, any colour
70. Roses: Fragrance, any other type of rose, any colour

DECORATIVE:

Fresh flowers except where specified.

71. Decorative: A Tribute to the Rodeo Division "Giddy Up 'N Go" **Prizes:** \$6, \$4, \$3
Incorporate the 2023 theme into your arrangement
72. Decorative: Decorated hat using dried horticultural materials, seeds, grasses, flowers etc., accessories allowed
73. Decorative: Miniature arrangement not over 3"w x 3"h including container & base if used
74. Decorative: Arrangement of flowers not over 5"w x 5"h
75. Decorative: Arrangement for special occasion such as new baby, graduation, birthday, accessories allowed
76. Decorative: Arrange of miniature roses, fresh materials to be used, keep the miniature roses as the main feature
77. Decorative: Men only arrangement in novel container, not to exceed 24" in height or width, accessories allowed
Prizes: \$6, \$4, \$3
78. Decorative: Floral arrangement using a common household item, not a vase
79. Decorative: Basket arrangement, flowers, any type, mixed colours, handle of basket must be usable & accessible
80. Decorative: Dining table arrangement of fresh flowers with candle(s)
81. Decorative: Christmas arrangement, accessories allowed
82. Decorative: Autumn bounty, a design using at least four of the following: flowers, fruit, vegetables
berries, grasses & grains
83. Decorative: Arrangement, Oriental in feeling, accessories allowed
84. Decorative: Novel container of fresh flowers
85. Decorative: Twins, a design using TWO containers that reflect each other
86. Decorative: Pattern in green, shades of green only a foliage & flower arrangement in nature's green hues
87. Decorative: Ahh, the roses, arrangement featuring roses
88. Decorative: Snow White, arrangement using white flowers with foliage in a variety of nature's green hues
89. Decorative: Teatime, arrangement using a teacup & saucer
90. Decorative: Charitable donation: Make YOUR favourite arrangement in a vase you are happy to give away
After the judging these arrangements will be given to a senior care home

NOTE: Arrangements will be judged on design, colour harmony, originality texture, harmony of materials, relation of container, condition of flowers & foliage.

PLEASE USE A WATER RECEPTACLE THAT IS EASILY WATERED & ADEQUATE TO MAINTAIN FLOWERS (Especially Minis) NO BAGGIES OR SARAN WRAP

POTTED PLANTS:

One plant per container except where specified, & pots not to exceed 12" across except where specified.

91. Potted Plants: African violet
92. Potted Plants: Tuberous begonia
93. Potted Plants: Fuchsia
94. Potted Plants: Geranium
95. Potted Plants: Any other type flowering plant not listed
96. Potted Plants: Foliage plant, one variety
97. Potted Plants: Mix of foliage plants
98. Potted Plants: Bonsai in container, living, no dried materials
99. Potted Plants: Topiary, living, no dried materials
100. Potted Plants: Rex begonia

Plants will be judged on:

Foliage - clean, healthy, of good colour.

Condition - all old foliage of blooms to be removed; must be free from blemish, pest, disease & damage.

Size - plant & pot size should be proper proportion.

Appearance - all entries should be in clean, attractive pots.

101. Hanging Plants: Hanging flowering house plants
102. Hanging Plants: Hanging foliage plant, non-bloomer
103. Hanging Plants: Hanging flowering plant, one variety
104. Hanging Plants: Mixed hanging basket, no size limit
105. Hanging Plants: Hanging ivy geranium, pot or basket

CONTAINER GARDENS:

106. Container Gardens: Cacti &/or succulent plants, accessories allowed, novel container
107. Container Gardens: Dish garden/fairy garden, accessories allowed, maximum container size 12" W x 6" D
Prize Money \$8, \$5, \$3
108. Container Gardens: Flowering patio pot, annuals or perennials, pot not to exceed 24", across

YOUTH CLASSES:

109. Youth: A Tribute to the Rodeo Division "Giddy Up 'N Go" Incorporate theme into your arrangement
110. Youth: Arrangement of 2 - 3 varieties of annuals, perennials or cacti/succulents
111. Youth: Novel (unusual) container of basket or potted plants, annuals, perennials or cacti/succulents
112. Youth: Ahh the roses, arrangement featuring roses, 1 container

JUNIOR CLASSES:

For boys & girls up to & including 12 years. Put age on entry form. Plants to be grown by exhibitor. Plant pots not to exceed 12" except where specified. One plant per container unless specified

113. Junior: A Tribute to the Rodeo Division "Giddy Up 'N Go" Incorporate theme into your arrangement

114. Youth: Arrangement using 2 to 3 varieties of annuals, perennials or cacti/succulents
115. Junior: Novel (unusual) container of basket or potted plants, annuals, perennials or cacti/succulents
116. Junior: Pretty in pink, arrangement featuring pink blooms, 1 container
117. Junior: Frisbee pond garden, accessories allowed, 2 to 5 years old: Ribbons only
118. Junior: Frisbee pond garden, accessories allowed 6 to 12 years old: Ribbons only
119. Junior: Mud pie, decorated with materials from nature such as flowers, leaves, seeds etc., ages 2 to 5 years
Prize: Ribbons only
120. Junior: Mud pie, decorated with materials from nature such as flowers, leaves, seeds etc., ages 6 to 12 years
Prize: Ribbons only
121. Junior: Egg faces with green hair
Slice the top off a hardboiled egg, clean out the contents of the shell. Decorate the shell with a face & fill with potting soil sprinkle with grass seed. Remember the seed needs light to grow & water to drink. Please plant at least 4 weeks before the fair so you have a good crop of hair. Display in egg cups these can be made from paper dixie cups.
