EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

- 1. One entry per exhibitor per class **except** in the case "for any other variety"
- 2. All fruit entered must be grown in the 2024 season.
- 3. Name of variety must be shown on entry form or entry will be disqualified.
- 4. **All** fruit and nuts must be grown by Exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
- 5. Fruit will be judged according to the Standards of Perfection as set out in the BC Circular #50C. This circular can be obtained from the Ministry in Victoria, or from your local branch of the Ministry of Agriculture.

EXHIBITS DROP OFF Horticultural Building, Monday, August 26th, 5-8pm or Tuesday, August 27th, 8-11am. You will receive your exhibitors after dropping off entries. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring in their exhibits on Monday evening to avoid congestion on the Tuesday morning.

SPECIALS:

57. Collection of fruit and nuts

Creative arrangement of local fruit (fresh or dried) and/or nuts in a basket, bowl, or cornauopia. Fruit and nuts may be home grown or purchased. Judged on quality, types, and volume of varieties exhibited.

58. 5 - Mcintosh apples grown by exhibitor north of Swan Lake.
